- Keynote Speaker Dr. Harold Young: Dr. Young is the Director of the Harold F. Young
 Neurosurgical Center at MCV. He is a Professor and James and Frances McGlothlin Chair for the
 Department of Neurosurgery at VCU. He has worked many years in the brain injury community,
 has won countless awards, and is recognized as one of the leading brain injury physicians
 amongst his peers.
- Legislator of the Year Delegate Eileen Filler-Corn: Delegate Filler-Corn serves in the Virginia
 House of Delegates representing the 41ST District. She has patroned and supported several bills
 and budget amendments to improve the lives of those who have sustained concussions. The
 Legislator of the Year award is given to a legislator in the House or Senate who has shown
 leadership that has been vital to the brain injury community.
- Weinstock Award Patti Goodall: Patti recently retired as the Director of Brain Injury Services
 at the Virginia Department of Aging and Rehabilitation Services. She has had a long and
 admirable career in disability services and supports, and was one of the first Supported
 Employment specialists in the country. The Weinstock Award recognizes people who are
 dedicated, committed, and raise public awareness on behalf of people with brain injuries.
- Legacy Award Dr. Nathan Zasler: Dr. Zasler is the CEO and Medical Director of the Concussion Centre of Virginia; Tree of Life. He has worked tirelessly to be a force within the rehabilitation community. The Legacy Award recognizes significant, long-term contributions of lasting impact to the field of brain injury.
