

Virginia Brain Injury Fact Sheet

- Between 2018 and 2020, 16,657 people were admitted to the ER with a traumatic brain injury (DARS Impact Report, 2021).
- More than 300,000 Virginians are estimated to have brain injury complications as a result of a traumatic brain injury or stroke (Brain Injury Association of Virginia, 2023).
- TBI's account for about 30% of all injury-related deaths to Virginia residents each year, and roughly 15% of all injury-related inpatient, acute care hospitalizations (VDH TBI Data and Trends Report, 2017).
- Of more than 15,000 TBI's reported to the Virginia Statewide Trauma Registry in 2021, 13% were classified as severe, 4% as moderate and 82% as mild.

State-Funded Programs

There are 9 community based programs serving persons with moderate to severe brain injury in Virginia; they are funded through a line-item appropriation in the state budget. In FY 2022:



Resource Coordination

Provides outreach to people recently hospitalized in Virginia for brain injury; information and referral, consultation and technical assistance services to persons with brain injury, family caregivers and professionals. The Brain Injury Association of Virginia is the sole provider, and covers the entire state.
