Community Resources & Support Manager

Seeking a person passionate about making the difference in the lives of individuals with a brain injury, their families and the professionals working in the field of brain injury. The Brain Injury Association of Virginia is looking for a dedicated Community Resources & Support Manager that will oversee connecting individuals to vital local resources, services and programs.

Primary Activities include:

- Receiving and responding to request for Information (I&R) and explore creative, new ways to provide high level of customer service to best meet the needs of those impacted by brain injury
- Coordinate and manage outreach activities
- Utilize Salesforce to collect data on request and responses, following data collection guidelines to maintain accuracy and consistency
- Evaluate the data collected to guide continuous improvement to BIAV services and for external service providers
- Manage all information provided through I&R including leading the I&R Team in assessing current resource needs, research new resources for inclusion in materials catalog and purge outdated materials
- Maintain current provider directory of all necessary health & behavioral health practitioners, assuring accuracy
- Facilitate online and in person support groups for individuals and their families/caregivers (3 total); Develop
 additional support groups as necessary with the Program team
- Manage technical assistance and provide training to support group leaders to improve program development and effectiveness
- Develop and present brain injury-related educational trainings and workshops to various constituencies
- Work with I & R team to recruit and utilize advisory group volunteers to provide input to BIAV's community resource catalog

- Bachelor's degree in a relevant field (e.g. Human Services, Health, Sports Management, Physical Therapy, Social Work)
- Master's degree (preferred)
- Brain Injury Specialist Certification achieved within one year of employment
- Attain Inform USA Aging/Disabilities (CRS-A/D) Certification within one year of employment
- Experience with non-profit operations, services, programs and external constituents

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Minimum Skill Requirements

- Effective and professional verbal and written communications
- Knowledge of Physical, psycho-social, behavioral and cognitive sequelae of brain injury and its impact on family and community systems
- High attention to detail
- Exceptional time management and organizational skills
- Proficiency with MSOffice and Salesforce database software applications
- Ability to work as an effective team member
- Pass pre-employment background screening
- High degree of confidentiality and diplomacy
- Knowledge of government entitlement and service delivery systems
